TAXES

AB 25, 1st Reprint - Residential Construction Tax (a.k.a. Park Tax): Expands Definition (Issue 1, page 1)

Clarifies that park funds must be: 1) expended in the neighborhood from which the funds were collected; and 2) must not be used for operation or maintenance expenses.

AB 32, 1st Reprint - Special Fuels: Expands Definition - Still Requires 2/3 vote. (Issue 1, page 1)

Deletes the phase-in of the rate increase. Changes the rate of increase to 6.4 cents and 21 cents per gallon of liquid petroleum gas and natural compressed gas respectively.

AB 71, 1st Reprint – Revises Vet Exemptions; Expands MBT Exemptions (Issue 1, page 2)

Reduces to 3 months the unemployed time of a veteran required for an employer to apply for the MBT credit upon hiring that veteran.

AB 191 1st Reprint- Motor Vehicle Fuel Taxes (Issue 5, page 29)

Changes the date of the approval of the ordinance if voters approve the question to January 1, 2017.

AB 203, 1st Reprint - Exemption to Car Rental Taxes (Issue 6, page 35)

Clarifies that the 10 % rental car tax excludes local taxes and fees, and the fee does not apply to a lease by the State or local government.

AB 316, 1st Reprint - Firearms Sales Tax Exemption (Issue 8, page 51)

Provides that the transfer or delivery to a federally licensed firearms dealer to facilitate the transfer from out-of-state does not require the imposition, collection or remittance of sales or use tax, unless the sale constitutes a retail sale by a retailer in another state.

AB 326 1st Reprint- Classic Cars: Tags and Vehicle Depreciation (Issue 8-Part 1, page 51)

Clarifies that a classic vehicle also includes a light commercial vehicle and is a vehicle manufactured before 1996.

AB 332 1st Reprint - Public Works Materials (Issue 8-Part 1, Page 51)

Changes the penalty of \$500,000 to \$250,000, and provides the contract may be express or implied.

TAXES Continued**AB 366, 1st Reprint- Motor Vehicle Fuel Tax Use (Issue 8-Part 1, page 52)**

Allows the payment of administrative costs that are directly incurred in connection with the project.

AB 372, 1st Reprint - Insurance Premium Tax Credit (Issue 8-Part 1, page 52)

Deletes the requirement that insurance tax collections must exceed projections to award a tax credit.

AB 380, 1st Reprint- Internet Sales Tax Collection (Issue 8-Part 1, page 52)

Requires the Department of Taxation to provide a report to LCB if they determine a retailer is not subject to the provisions of this bill. Provides that a retailer may rebut the presumption that the activities of a component or resident is not significantly associated with retailer's ability to establish or maintain a market for their product or services during the prior four quarters.

AB 412, 1st Reprint- Property Tax Changes (Issue 8-Part 1, page 53)

Provides that the imposition of the 5 cents per \$100 of assessed valuation levied by County Commissioner must not be allocated or included in the calculation of amounts to be allocated to a redevelopment agency.

AB 452, 1st Reprint- Assessment Appeal Clarification (Issue 9, page 70)

Clarifies who the written authorization may be signed by and provides the procedure and time frame for filing an objection to a written authorization.

SB 36, 1st Reprint – State Business License: Exemption for Emergency Services Providers (Issue 1, page 3)

Clarifies provisions describing activities of an emergency service provider.

SB 94, 1st Reprint - Film Tax Credits (Issue 3, page 18)

Retains the definition of "Below-the-line-personnel."

SB 103, 1st Reprint - Modification to Modified Business Tax Financial Institutions for Insurance (Issue 3, page 18)

Deletes the reference to home and auto insurance and now applies to all insurance categories.

SB 127, 1st Reprint – Motor Vehicles: Refunds and Credits (Issue 4, page 24)

Limits the credit of registration fees to the term of the vehicle registration the person is turning in. Clarifies that a credit may only be applied to another vehicle owned by the person.

SB 155, 1st Reprint – Special Fuels Tax Refund for Farmers, Ranchers; Farm License Plates (Issue 5, page 29)

Expands the definition of "implement of husbandry" to include a farm vehicle used exclusively for agricultural purposes on the farm or ranch.

SB 252, 1st Reprint – Governor's Business License Tax (Tax Memo, 3/16/15)

This bill has a number of amendments. A preamble is added to express support for improving and funding education. Allows for the annual filing and payment of the Business License Tax (BLT) if a business pays no wages. Does not allow a change of accounting method more than once every three years. Makes various changes to insurance and the calculation of insurance premium tax for the BLT. Provides a due process provision for a business which receives a notice that their Nevada business license is revoked or suspended from the Department of Taxation. Does not allow interest and penalty to be charged for an error in filing a return, which is not a willful error, prior to September 1, 2016, and provides that any subsequent audit will not include penalty and interest for the period ending September 1, 2016.

TAXES Continued**SB 312, 1st Reprint – Lodging Tax: Reno Casinos - Still Requires 2/3 vote. (Issue 8-Part 1, page 53)**

Adds a second surcharge of \$2 and includes the provisions to County Commission. Expands the surcharge to all hotels and specifies the uses of the surcharge.

SB 334 1st Reprint- Medical Equipment Exemption (Issue 8-Part 1, page 53)

Qualifies that medical equipment must be “durable.”

SB 382 1st Reprint- Internet Sales Tax Collection (Issue 8-Part 1, page 54)

The amendments are the same as for AB 380 1st Reprint, reported this Issue, page 84.

FEES**AB 39, 1st Reprint – Physician Visa Waiver Fee (Issue 1, page 4) – Maintains 2/3s Majority**

Increases the cap on the application fee to \$2,000 from \$500. The original bill sought to repeal the application fee.

AB 42 1st Reprint – Fee Modification of Records Request – (Issue 1, page 4) – Removes 2/3s Majority

Removes fees altogether for abstracting information for the Division of Health.

AB 77, 1st Reprint – Sheep Tax and Agricultural Fees (Issue 1, page 2) - Maintains 2/3s Majority

Removes proposed fee for test and licensing of weighing and measuring devices and cash registers. The State Sealer is to conduct random inspections of cash registers and may impose penalties to be set. Moves certain provisions of NRS 583 to NRS 446.

AB 81, 1st Reprint – Alcohol and Drug Abuse Fees (Issue 1, page 5) – Removes 2/3s Majority

Leaves the current fee structure and definition of facility in place.

AB 85, 1st Reprint – Addiction Counselors and Interns (Issue 1, page 5) – Maintains 2/3s Majority

Creates a new category of license, “Peer Support Specialist”, for certification by the Board of Examiners for Alcohol, Drug and Gambling Counselors with fees and investigation requirements to be set according to existing statute. Initial fee is not to exceed \$150 and renewals are not to exceed \$300.

AB 89, 1st Reprint – Employment of Veterans and Other Professionals (Issue 1, page 5) - Maintains 2/3s Majority

Adds American Osteopathic Association and certain Canadian entity certification to eligibility for license by endorsement and adjusts licensing requirements for dentists and hygienists. Deletes the fees to be charged to active military and family members for provisional licenses related to social workers. Clarifies the conditions of reciprocal licensing. Creates a dentistry facility inspection fee of \$500. Deletes the proposed increases in the schedule of fees for social worker licenses.

AB 117, 1st Reprint – School Bus Leasing (Issue 3, page 19)

Clarifies what costs must be included in computing the fee for bus use and that the fee must be computed by the school transportation department or school board. Clarifies liability, insurance, driver selection and other requirements of the lessee.

AB 132, 1st Reprint – Termination of Domestic Partnership (Issue 4, page 25) – Maintains 2/3s Majority

Increases to \$30 from \$20 the additional fee charged by county clerks for divorce filings.

FEES Continued**AB 136, 1st Reprint – Hunting Licenses (Issue 4, page 25) – Removes 2/3s Majority**

Instead of waiving requirements for handicapped hunters to complete a responsibility course, requires the Department of Wildlife to make reasonable accommodations for the disabled to participate in the course. Clarifies the type of firearm a hunter may carry for self-defense purposes. Effective date changed to July 1, 2015.

AB 146, 1st Reprint – Vehicle Emission Inspections (Issue 4, page 25) – Adds 2/3s Majority – Declared Exempt.

Removes all proposed changes to frequency of emission inspections and instead exempts vehicles manufactured before 1966 from emissions testing. Imposes a fee, equal to emissions compliance fees, on first issue of license tags to exempted vehicles. Classic vehicles registered before July 1, 2015 are exempt if the fee was paid at the time of the earlier registration.

AB 183, 1st Reprint – Deed in Lieu of Foreclosure Penalties (Issue, 5, page 30) – Maintains 2/3s Majority

Adds the “grantor of a deed in lieu” to who can bring action.

AB 197, 1st Reprint – Out-of-School Recreation Program Permits (Issue 5, page 30) – Removes 2/3s Majority

Removes the proposed fee schedule for non-government providers, but leaves the requirement to comply with health and safety standards imposed on local government providers of recreational programs. Imposes a \$500 civil penalty for non-compliance.

AB 231, 1st Reprint – Chiropractic Re-Licensing (Issue 6, page 35) – Maintains 2/3s Majority

Provides the Board will pay the costs for the mental or physical exam when competency is questioned.

AB 246, 1st Reprint – Cosmetology Licensing (Issue 7, page 41) – Maintains 2/3s Majority

Revises proposed regulation of shampoo technologists to registration versus licensing, including reducing required apprentice hours and giving the board authority to administer a practical exam. Clarifies exemption of certain massages by cosmetologists and that license fees cited in the bill are for initial issue and renewals.

AB 258, 1st Reprint – “Crowdfunding” Securities Registration (Issue 7, page 15) - Maintains 2/3s Majority

Requires filing with the Securities Division of the Secretary of State and clarifies the written confirmations required from purchasers. Changes the offering vehicle to “an” internet website” rather than “one or more” sites.

AB 268, 1st Reprint – Foster Care Licensing (Issue 7, page 42) – Maintains 2/3s Majority

Clarifies the rules governing investigations of applicants to operate a foster home or supervise children in that home.

AB 292, 1st Reprint – Telehealth Providers (Issue 7, page 42)

Clarifies description of equipment used for telehealth services and exempts certain providers of health programs for American Indians from the requirement to be licensed in Nevada.

AB 305, 1st Reprint – Paramedicine Services (Issue 7, page 42) – Removes 2/3s Majority

Deletes the proposed fee for a permit endorsement to allow emergency medical providers to deliver community paramedicine services.

AB 325, 1st Reprint – Private Guardian Licensing (Issue 8-Part 1, page 55) – Maintains 2/3s Majority

Amends provisions regarding who must be given preference to be appointed as a guardian.

AB 450, 1st Reprint – I-11 Toll Road Project (Issue 9, page 71) – Maintains 2/3s Majority - Declared Exempt

Completely replaces the original bill language, broadening it beyond the I-11 project. Requires any money beyond the costs of the public-private partnership be deposited in the Highway Fund for road construction and maintenance. Allows a partnership to use property, as granted, without property taxes. Directs the NDOT Board to set tolls and approve exemptions and create a policy to protect personal information used in collecting and enforcing user fees.

SB 6, 1st Reprint – Creates Medical Homes (Issue 1, page 5) – Removes 2/3 Majority

Deletes proposed creation of a special office to monitor and certify medical homes for a fee. Instead, requires accreditation by a nationally recognized organization in the field of patient-centered medical homes. Requires the State Board of Health and Insurance Commissioner to develop requirements and exemptions for insurance of these entities.

SB 38, 1st Reprint – Associated Gaming Equipment Licensing (Issue 2, page 8) – Maintains 2/3s Majority

Adds provisions allowing certain alumni and state or local bar organizations to conduct charitable lotteries under certain conditions. Adds new provisions related to “club venues” in nonrestricted gaming establishments, including registration and fee requirements for club venue employees. Changes proposed requirements for associated gaming equipment to registration instead of licensing, and removes proposed license fees from the bill.

SB 39, 1st Reprint – Business Associations (Issue 1, page 6) – Removes 2/3s Majority

Removes the proposed requirement that a registered agent accept process, notice or demand for represented entities and amends or deletes other proposed requirements for registered agents. Removes the requirement for the Secretary of State to conduct periodic investigations but maintains authority to investigate suspected violations. Removes the proposed fees for an intent to dissolve filing.

SB 44, 1st Reprint – Oil and Gas (Issue 1, page 6) – Maintains 2/3s Majority

Sets maximum amounts for permit fees to be determined by the Commission on Mineral Resources as follows: permit to drill and operate an oil or gas well not intended to be hydraulically fractured, \$2,000; for such a well that is intended to be hydraulically fractured, \$5,000; for a change request on an existing permit, \$400. The costs of administering change request is now included in costs used to determine fees. Hydraulic Fracturing is now defined in a new section of NRS 522.

SB 65, 1st Reprint – Water Use (Issue 1, page 6) – Maintains 2/3s Majority

Makes technical changes to this extensive bill and raises the fee for filing proof of beneficial use from \$350 to \$410.

SB 67, 1st Reprint – Insurance Providers (Issue 1, page 6) – Maintains 2/3s Majority

Adds provisions on when and how the insurance commissioner may adopt the Valuation Manual of the National Association of Insurance Commissioners.

SB 68, 1st Reprint – Physician Licensing (Issue 1, page 7) – Maintains 2/3s Majority

Expands the expedited licensing to a number of other specialties. Adds fingerprinting requirements for those seeking a license by endorsement to practice medicine, podiatry or provide health care services.

SB 110, 1st Reprint – Abandoned Recreational Vehicles (Issue 3, page 19) – Maintains 2/3s Majority

Sets a procedure for obtaining title, without payment, to an abandoned recreational vehicle on one’s property and requires certain solid waste disposal landfills to accept such vehicles if applicable fees are paid. The abandoned vehicle may also be sold by the property owner or occupant after obtaining title. The DMV may charge a fee, based on costs, for issuing the title.

FEES Continued**SB 121, 1st Reprint – Classic Car Tags (Issue 3, page 19) – Maintains 2/3s Majority**

Clarifies that personalized plates may be requested for classic cars entitled to the classic car status as long as both fees are paid. The personalized plate will be issued instead of the classic car status plate.

Effective: Upon passage and approval for regulations and January 1, 2016 or when sufficient DMV resources are available to make the changes, whichever occurs later, for all other purposes.

SB 163, 1st Reprint – Council on Wildlife Conservation – (Issue 5, page 30) - Removes 2/3s Majority

Removes the proposed additional \$3 hunting, fishing, trapping fees and authorizes the Department of Wildlife to fund the Council from the Wildlife Heritage Trust Account.

SB 181, 1st Reprint – Anesthesiology Assistant Licensing – (Issue 5, page 30) – Maintains 2/3s Majority

Reduces the proposed application fee to \$400 and annual registration fee to \$800 for anesthesiologist assistants. Reduces the proposed license fee for application and renewal of osteopathic anesthesiologist assistants to \$400.

SB 210, 1st Reprint – Medical Facility for the Dependent Inspections – (Issue 6, page 36) – Adds 2/3s Majority

Changes the bill to require the Board to establish a grading system for results of inspections, with fees for re-inspection aligned with the grade received in the initial inspection. Two consecutive grade A inspections warrant a reduction in license renewal fee.

Effective: Upon passage and approval for regulations and October 1, 2015 for all other purposes.

SB 229, 1st Reprint – Second Amendment License Tags (Issue 7, page 42) – Maintains 2/3s Majority

Narrows the use of special license tag proceeds by the Nevada Firearms Coalition to “provide or pay for firearm training or firearm safety education.”

SB 271, 1st Reprint – Virgin Valley Water District (Issue 7, page 43) – Maintains 2/3s Majority

Removes the fee exemption from annual renewal letters for a commitment to supply water service issued before July 1, 2015.

SB 285, 1st Reprint – Constable Fees, Duties (Issue 7, page 44) – Maintains 2/3s Majority

Adds authorization for county boards to appoint a reasonable number of clerks and set their compensation for the constable of a township. Adjusts the rules governing constable offices and personnel according to county population.

SB 286, 1st Reprint – Crematorium Licensing (Issue 8-Part 1, page 56) – Maintains 2/3s Majority

Prohibits offering cremation services on the internet except by a licensed funeral establishment or crematory. Extends certain license terms to two years from one, with a standard January 1 renewal date in even numbered years. Replaces the term death care consultant with funeral arranger.

SB 288, 1st Reprint – Drug Prescribers (Issue 8, page 56) – Removes 2/3s Majority

Removes the registration and fee requirement for prescribers of controlled substances. Requires all “authorized” to prescribe and dispense controlled substances to get the database training and update the Board’s website database every 6 months.

SB 305, 1st Reprint – Hemp Farming (Issue 8-Part 1, page 56) – Removes 2/3s Majority

Removes proposed registration fees for industrial growers and limits authority to grow the product for research purposes to institutions of higher learning and the Department of Agriculture.

FEES Continued**SB 306, 1st Reprint – Common Interest Community Liens (Issue 8-Part 1, page 56) – Maintains 2/3s Majority**

Requires mortgage companies to provide name and contact information of buyers to the Division of Financial Institutions so mediation program information may be sent directly to them.

SB 373, 1st Reprint – Travel Insurance Providers (Issue 8-Part 1, page 57) – Maintains 2/3s Majority

Deletes sections 16-18, 20-23 and 25-34. Fees remain unchanged.

SB 388, 1st Reprint – Divorce Fees (Issue 8-Part 1, page 57) – Maintains 2/3s Majority

Inserts clarifying language about when these fees are to be imposed and broadens the use of the funds collected to purposes which benefit the district court rather than the juvenile courts.

SB 395, 1st Reprint – Marriage Tourism (Issue 8, page 57)

Limits authority for imposition by the county board of the additional \$14 marriage license fee to promote marriage tourism to Clark County. Removes gender references and qualifies what type of promotional materials may be placed outside the county clerk's office.

SB 404, 1st Reprint – Moped Registration (Issue 8-Part 1, page 57) – Maintains 2/3s Majority

Changes the moped registration to a one-time requirement which lasts until ownership is transferred or the owner surrenders the plates. Motorcycle registration fees of \$33 plus license plate, inspection fees, and governmental services tax apply at the time of registration. The license plate must be distinct from a motorcycle plate. Mopeds are exempt from emissions testing.

SB 441, 1st Reprint – Cottage Food Industry (Issue 9, page 73) – Maintains 2/3s Majority

Adds "craft food operation" to the list of exclusions from food establishment definition. Craft food operations are subject to training, examination, registration and reasonable fees to be set by the Department of Agriculture.

SB 443, 2nd Reprint – Race Book, Sports Pool Wagers (Issue 9, page 73) -Removes 2/3s Majority

Removes registration and fee provisions and provides that race book or sports pools may accept wagers from certain business entities that have established an account with the book or pool according to certain guidelines. Regulations are to be established by the Gaming Commission.

SB 488, 1st Reprint – Animal Remedy Products (Issue 9, page 73) – Maintains 2/3s Majority

Changes the requirement to an authorization to establish this registration program and directs the Department of Agriculture to establish a "reasonable" annual fee for registration of each product, removing the previously proposed maximum of \$75 per product. Makes the registration and renewal deadline July 1 of each year.

SB 495, 1st Reprint – Commercial Animal Feed Licensing (Issue 9, page 73) – Maintains 2/3s Majority

Requires manufacturers, distributors and guarantors of commercial animal feed to be licensed by the state and pay quarterly fees and submit quarterly reports. Replaces existing labeling requirements and prohibits re-use of packaging. Issuance and renewal of the annual license are not to exceed \$75. The quarterly fees, to be established by the Department, are per ton of commercial feed or \$5, whichever is greater. The Department may inspect or audit any licensee and charge fees according to cost.

SB 502, 1st Reprint – DMV Technology Fee (Issue 9, page 74) – Maintains 2/3s Majority

Clarifies that the \$1 technology fee may be added to any transaction for which a fee is charged. The fee will go into effect once the DMV notifies the Governor and LCB that resources are in place and publishes that fact on its website.

Effective: July 1, 2015 and upon publication of notification on the DMV website.
