## INITIATIVE PETITIONS

*Per the Nevada Constitution, Article 19, NRS 293.1276-293.12795 and NRS 295.015 – 295.056, Initiative petitions that are declared sufficient by the Secretary of State are delivered to the Legislature on the first day of session. If the Legislature fails to act within the first 40 days of the session, the initiative will appear on the ballot for the next general election.*

### **IP1 – Legalization of Marijuana** - Introduced on 2/2/2015. Referred to Committee on Judiciary.

Provides for legal sale of marijuana in the state to people 21 years of age or older but maintains that driving under the influence will remain illegal. Administration, licensing and regulation is to be under Department of Taxation. Initial licensing fees range from \$30,000 to \$10,000 and renewal fees from \$10,000 to \$3,300 depending on license category. A 15 percent excise tax is imposed on wholesale sales. Revenue is first to cover Department costs and then to be credited to the Distributive School Account.

Effective: October 1, 2015 if approved by the Legislature or January 1, 2017 if approved by the voters.

NTA Comment: There are many differences between this initiative and the statute governing medical marijuana starting with the tax rate, which for medical marijuana is currently 2 percent. If this initiative passes, either by the legislature or the voters, is it correct to assume that the legislature will have to reconcile the differences?

### **IP2 – Control of Firearms** - Introduced on 2/2/2015. Referred to Committee on Judiciary.

Requires background checks on all firearm sales and transfers by licensed and unlicensed persons including sales and transfers to family members, hunters and for self-defense.

Effective: October 1, 2015 if approved by the Legislature or January 1, 2017 if approved by the voters.

## TAXES

### **AB 95 – Business License Exemption**

Sponsor: Assemblyman Hansen; referred to Committee on Judiciary. (BDR 7-34)

Changes the state business license threshold for home based businesses to gross earnings of more than \$60,000 (currently 66 2/3 percent of the average annual wage). Expands applicability to entities operating from the home of a shareholder, officer, trustee and others related to the business.

Effective: Upon passage and approval for administration and regulations and July 1, 2015 for all other purposes.

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**TAXES CONTINUED**

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**AB 96 – Property Tax Payments**

Sponsor: Assemblyman Hansen; referred to Committee on Taxation. (BDR 32-401)

Allows resident owners of single-family residences to pay property taxes in eight equal monthly installments from August 5 through March 5 if the taxes on the residence exceed \$100.

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**SB 94 - Transferable Film Tax Credits\***

Sponsor: Senator Ford; referred to Committee on Revenue and Economic Development. (BDR 32-58)

Changes the life-of-program expenditure cap to an annual appropriated amount and eliminates the expiration date of the program and the local government fee abatement authorization. Changes the eligibility from a producer to a production company and makes various changes to qualifying expenses, and application process and timing of credit issuance. Also increases the amount of credit, among other matters.

\*The tax credits which can be transferred are: the modified business tax on both general business and financial institutions, the gross gaming tax, and the insurance premium tax.

**NTA Position: OPPOSE.** While many of the changes tighten up the requirements for obtaining the credit, a company without a sufficient tax liability shouldn't be eligible for the credit.

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**SB 95 - Publication of Property Tax Rolls**

Sponsor: Senator Parks; referred to Committee on Revenue and Economic Development. (BDR 32-630)

Authorizes county commissions and boards to direct the county assessor to publish the secured property tax rolls on the assessor's or the county's website in lieu of publishing it in the newspaper. Notice must be published that the website records are available. In counties other than Clark and Washoe, at least 10 copies of the list must be available in the county office for 60 days.

**NTA Position: SUPPORT.** This bill would allow a county to have some control over the cost of printing the roll.

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**SB 103 - Modification to MBT Financial Institutions for Insurance**

Sponsors: Senators Settlemeyer and Denis; referred to Committee on Revenue and Economic Development. (BDR 32-42)

Moves those who primarily sell motor vehicle and homeowner insurance from the financial institution category to the general employer category for computation of the Modified Business Tax. This will apply beginning the first calendar quarter after the effective date.

Effective: Upon passage and approval.

**NTA Position: SUPPORT.** This bill should be amended to eliminate the MBT for financial institutions and have those businesses pay the same rate as general business.

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**FEES**

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**AB 103 – Veteran License Tags**

Sponsor: Assemblyman Oscarson; Co-sponsor: Senator Goicoechea; referred to Committee on Transportation. (BDR 43-22)

Requires special license plates be developed for Silver and Bronze Star recipients. These plates are exempt from existing requirements for special plates as well as the upcharge for special license plates. If the plates need replacement, the fee is \$5.00.

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**FEES CONTINUED****AB 115 – Speech-Language Pathology, Audiology and Hearing Aid Dispensing Board – Requires 2/3s Majority**

Sponsors: Assemblywomen Benitez-Thompson and Bustamante Adams; Co-Sponsors: Senators Spearman and Parks; Referred to Committee on Commerce and Labor. (BDR 54-165)

Combines the Board of Hearing Aid Specialists and Board of Examiners for Audiology and Speech Pathology into the Speech-Language Pathology, Audiology and Hearing Aid Dispensing Board to handle licensing and oversight of these professions and reclassifies them as providers of health care. Raises the application and licensing fees and establishes an examination fee of \$300 among others. Revenue is to pay the expenses of the Board.

Effective: Upon passage and approval for regulations and administrative tasks and October 1, 2015 for all other purposes.

**AB 117 – School Bus Leasing**

Requested by Committee on Education and referred to same. (BDR 34-510)

Authorizes school district boards to enter written agreements to lease school buses with certain provisions, including a fee covering the operating cost per mile and any additional vehicle use costs or expenses.

**SB 110 - Abandoned Recreational Vehicles - Requires 2/3s Majority**

Sponsor: Senator Goicoechea; referred to Committee on Health and Human Services. (BDR 43-609)

Sets forth the procedure for a property owner to secure a letter of abandonment from the DMV for abandoned recreational vehicles found on private property and for disposal of such vehicles. The DMV may charge a fee based on actual costs of producing the letter of abandonment.

**SB 121 – Special License Plates – Requires 2/3s Majority**

Sponsor: Senator Brower, on request; referred to Committee on Transportation. (BDR 43-413)

Allows “classic rod” and “classic vehicle” special license plates to also be personalized if both fees are paid.

Effective: January 1, 2016

**BUSINESS****AB 129 – Garnishment Limits**

Requested by Committee on Judiciary and referred to same. (BDR 2-541)

Increases the exempted amount of gross weekly wages for debtors in certain income categories; provides debtor recourse if an out-of-state judgment is applied without proper in-state filing; and other matters such as employers as garnishees and reporting.

Effective: October 1, 2015

**SB 108 - Public Works Threshold**

Sponsor: Senator Settlemeyer; referred to Committee on Government Affairs

Raises the threshold from \$100,000 to \$1,000,000 for general and prevailing wage provisions for public works projects. Applies to projects awarded after July 1, 2015.

**APPROPRIATIONS - NOT INCLUDED IN EXECUTIVE BUDGET****SB 122 – Materials Recovery Facilities**

Sponsors: Senators Denis and Swank; referred to Committee on Commerce, Labor and Energy. (BDR 54-893)

Appropriates \$10,000 from the General Fund to the Legislative Fund for an outside study of the promotion of the use of materials recovery facilities including the impacts of requiring contractors to dispose of solid materials from building and other projects at such facilities. Requires contractors to use such facilities for disposal of solid materials. Leftover funds revert to the General Fund on or before September 15, 2017.

**EDUCATION - NEVADA SYSTEM OF HIGHER EDUCATION****AB 111 – Guinn Scholarship.**

Sponsor: Assemblyman Kirner; referred to Committee on Education. (BDR 34-258)

Over the next two years, increases the number of enrolled credit hours required for maintaining eligibility and increases the number of semester hours eligible for payment but maintains the current \$10,000 cumulative maximum amount per student.

Effective: July 1, 2015, July 1, 2016 and July 1, 2017.

**EDUCATION - K-12****SB 106 - School Bond Rollover**

Sponsors: Senator Smith, et al (2 co-sponsors); Joint Sponsor: Assemblywoman Kirkpatrick; Referred to Committee on Government Affairs. (BDR 30-139)

Allows school districts, if certain conditions are met, to issue general obligation bonds for an additional 10 years and during that period to use excess debt service revenue for “pay as you go” funding. Exempts school district property tax revenue for debt service from certain abatements until the bonds are retired.

**NTA Position: This bill needs to be amended.** to provide clarification as to: (1) whether the rollover property tax rate is the original rate approved by the voters or the actual amount of the rollover rate that was utilized, (2) what remedy might be available if a rollover has expired and another local government in the county is now using the rate that was available for the rollover. Additionally, while the language in SB 119 and this bill are almost identical, this bill addresses the issue of the property tax partial abatement.

**SB 119 - School Bond Rollover; Prevailing Wage**

Sponsors: Senators Harris and Kieckhefer; referred to Committee on Government Affairs. (BDR 28-732)

Exempts school and NSHE projects from prevailing wage requirements. Allows school districts, if certain conditions are met, to issue general obligation bonds for an additional 10 years and to use excess debt service for capital projects.

Effective: Upon passage and approval.

**NTA Position: This bill needs to be amended.** See SB 106 above. Note: The issue of property tax abatements is addressed.

**SB 120 – Teacher Layoffs**

Sponsor: Senator Brower; referred to Committee on Government Affairs. (BDR 23-595)

Mandates that performance evaluations must be considered on the same level as seniority when laying off a teacher or administrator.

**NTA Position: SUPPORT.** Positive performance evaluations are more important than the length of time a person has been a teacher.

**STATE GOVERNMENT****AB 104 – Charter Agencies**

Requested by Committee on Government Affairs and referred to same. (BDR 18-762)

Allows the Governor to declare any Executive Branch department as a charter agency with all employee positions becoming unclassified. A charter agency will have set, public annual performance goals with annual reviews and failure repercussions. Performance bonuses are authorized. Provision is made for funding, annual reporting to the Legislative Commission and other exemptions and accommodations to state agency requirements.

Effective: July 1, 2015 and expires by limitation on June 30, 2021.

**STATE GOVERNMENT****AB 105 – PERS Board**

Requested by Committee on Government Affairs, referred to Committee on Commerce and Labor. (BDR 23-682)

Increases the PERS Board to eight members to include the State Treasurer as an ex-officio member. The other seven members are appointed by the Governor.

Effective: October 1, 2015.

**LOCAL GOVERNMENT****AB 116 – Clark County: Regional Business Development Advisory Council**

Sponsor: Assemblywoman Bustamante Adams, referred to Committee on Taxation. (BDR S-263)

Adds representatives from the Southern Nevada Health District and Regional Housing Authority and eliminates representatives from the Housing Authorities of Las Vegas, North Las Vegas and Clark County, Clark County Health and Sanitation Districts, Las Vegas Urban Chamber of Commerce and the Hispanic Business Roundtable. Extends the LCB reporting requirements of the Council beyond the five-year limitation. Entities that request to participate in the Council are non-voting members.

Effective: Upon passage and approval.

**AB 127 – Regulation of Firearms to State**

Sponsor: Assemblymen Hambrick and O'Neill; Joint Sponsors: Senators Gustavson and Settlemeyer; referred to Committee on Government Affairs. (BDR 20-74)

Gives the State control over firearm regulations and policies and voids any local government regulations on firearm sales, purchases, possession, carrying, ownership, transportation, storage, registration and licensing.

Effective: Upon passage and approval

**SB 115 - Clark County: Town Advisory Boards**

Sponsor: Senator Hardy; referred to Committee on Government Affairs. (BDR 21-241)

Requires members of an unincorporated city's town advisory board in Clark County that is located more than 25 miles from Las Vegas be elected by voters of the town. If not enough candidates file for election, the Clark County board is to fill the empty seats by appointment. Applies to towns established before October 1, 2015 and does not affect the current terms of members serving on that date.

**ELECTIONS****AB 118 – Candidate Residency**

Sponsors: Assembly Members Hickey and Kirkpatrick; referred to Committee on Legislative Operations and Elections. (BDR 23-761)

Clarifies the language defining a candidate's residence for purposes of election eligibility, limits the time frame for district court jurisdiction on residency, and gives authority for expulsion to the appropriate Legislative house in cases of residency.

**SB 104 - Political Advertising**

Sponsor: Senator Settlemeyer; referred to Committee on Legislative Operations and Elections. (BDR 24-86)

Exempts from the sponsor and candidate disclosure requirements of NRS 294A.347-.348 all articles of clothing and items such as pens, magnets, combs, etc. with a retail value less than \$5.00. Printed items such as door hangers, bumper stickers, yard signs, etc. are not exempt.

Effective: October 1, 2015

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**SCR 1 – Professional Development of Education Personnel**

Requested by the Committee on Legislative Operations and Elections and referred to same. (BDR R-406)

Directs the Legislative Commission to appoint a 6-member committee to do an interim study on the costs, use of facilities, effectiveness and other matters related to professional development of teachers and administrators and report to the 79<sup>th</sup> Legislative Session.

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**AB 122 – Modernist Architecture Day**

Sponsors: Assemblywoman Swank, et al (13 co-sponsors); referred to Committee on Government Affairs. (BDR 19-538)

Establishes May 20 each year as Nevada Modernist Architecture Day, a day of observance.

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**AB 123 – State Dance**

Sponsor: Assemblywoman Titus, et al (11 co-sponsors); referred to Committee on Government Affairs. (BDR 19-677)

Establishes square dancing as the official dance of the State.

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**RESOLUTIONS PASSED BY THE 2013 LEGISLATURE AND RETURNED BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE**

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**SJR 8\* - Annual Legislative Sessions.** Introduced on 2/2/2015. Referred to Committee on Legislative Operations and Elections.

Proposes to amend the Nevada Constitution to allow regular legislative sessions of not more than 90 days in odd-numbered years and not more than 30 days in even-numbered years. Changes the legislator pay and expense schedule.

Note: This Resolution was passed by the 2013 Legislature. If this resolution is passed by the 2015 Legislature, it must then be approved by the voters in the next general election for this change to the Constitution to become effective.

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**SJR 13\* - Same Sex Marriage.** Introduced on 2/2/2015. Referred to Committee on Legislative Operations and Elections.

Requires the State and localities to recognize all marriages, regardless of gender, and treat all equally under the law. Preserves the right of religious organizations and clergy to refuse to solemnize a marriage.

Note: This Resolution was passed by the 2013 Legislature. If this resolution is passed by the 2015 Legislature, it must then be approved by the voters in the next general election for this change to the Constitution to become effective.
