TAXES: Fuel and Vehicle

SB 114 – Electric Vehicles: State Surcharge for Electric Service at Charging Station - Requires 2/3 Majority

Requested by Senator Settelmeyer. Referred to Committee on Growth and Infrastructure. (BDR 58-596)

Imposes a 10% surcharge on sales of electric service through an electric vehicle charging station. Requires the seller of the service to remit the tax 30 days following the month the charge was collected to the Department of Motor Vehicles. Provides a 2% collection allowance.

Effective: Upon passage and approval for regulations. January 1, 2020 for all other purposes.

TAXES: Sales

AB 113 – Firearm Sales

Requested by Assemblywoman Titus. Referred to Committee on Taxation. (BDR 32-659)

The delivery or transfer of a firearm from outside Nevada by a person in Nevada who is a licensed firearms dealer shall not be considered a sale by the Department of Taxation. The delivery must be to facilitate the transfer from outside Nevada, or the sales price must be paid to the dealer outside of Nevada.

MISCELLANEOUS TAXES

AB 117 - Gaming: Charitable Lotteries and Charitable Gaming - Requires 2/3 Majority

Requested by the Committee on Judiciary and referred to same. (BDR 41-715)

Revises the provisions for charitable lotteries and gaming including but not limited to allowing the Gaming Control Board to establish operator fees by regulation, providing how a nonprofit can become a qualified organization, to capping the total value of prizes for charitable games to \$500,000.

Effective: October 1, 2019.

FEES, FINES & PENALTIES

SB 125 – Landscape Architects: Credit and Debit Cards - Requires 2/3 Majority

Requested by Senator Hardy. Referred to Committee on Commerce and Labor. (BDR 54-612)

Allows the board to enter into contracts to provide for the acceptance of credit and debit cards for the "payment of fees". Increases the cap on maximum amount of fees that can be charged and adds fees for an intern. Specifies fees need to be paid in advance.

NTA POSITION: AMEND. The fees set by regulation should not exceed the cost of providing the service.

SB 128 – Professions, Occupation and Business Issues: Credit and Debit Cards - Requires 2/3 Majority

Requested by Committee on Commerce and Labor. On behalf of the Sunset Commission of the Legislative Commission (BDR 54-518)

Allows specified Occupational Licensing Boards to enter into contracts to provide for the acceptance of credit and debit cards and the electronic transfer of money upon the approval of the Director of the Office of Finance. A fee may be charged, however, the total fees collected cannot exceed the total of the fees charged to the agency.

BUSINESS ISSUES**AB 90 – Expansion of Sick Leave**

Requested by Committee on Commerce and Labor and referred to same. On behalf of the Legislative Committee on Senior Citizens, Veterans and Adults with Special Needs. (BDR 53-169)

Requires a business that provides paid or unpaid sick leave to its employees to allow employees to use that leave to assist a member of their immediate family with an illness. Allows employer to limit the amount of sick leave an employee uses for an immediate family member to no less than the amount of sick leave the employee accrues during a 6-month period. Requires the Labor Commissioner to prepare a bulletin explaining the provisions for employers and to conspicuously display the bulletin. “Immediate family” is defined as a child, spouse, domestic partner, sibling, parent, mother-in-law, father-in-law, grandchild, grandparent, or stepparent.

Effective: October 1, 2019

AB 101 – Private Actions

Requested by Assemblyman Daly. Referred to Committee on Judiciary. (BDR 3-26)

A private plaintiff may bring an action for a declaratory judgement against a state or political subdivision for purposes of determining a violation against state law or a local ordinance.

NTA Comment: A political subdivision is defined in NRS 41.0305.

SB 119 - OSHA

Requested by Senators Cancela, Parks et al (2) and Joint Sponsor Assemblywoman Martinez. Referred to Committee on Commerce and Labor. (BDR 53-570)

Expands the OSHA 10 Course and OSHA 30 Course to include employees who work at exhibitions, conventions and trade shows. Makes other changes including establishing administrative fines.

Effective: January 1, 2020 for sections 1-13 and January 1, 2021 for sections 14 and 15.

EDUCATION: K-12**AB 92 – English Mastery Council**

Requested by Committee on Education. On behalf of the Legislative Committee on Education. (BDR 34-393)

Extends the termination date of English Mastery Council from July 1, 2019, to July 1, 2022. Authorizes English Mastery Council to make recommendations to State Board of Education to improve English proficiency in non-English language speakers who scored below 25th percentile in English language.

Effective: Upon passage and approval.

AB 99 – Founding Principles of American Government

Requested by Assemblyman Wheeler. Referred to Committee on Education. (BDR 34-132)

Adds Federalists Papers, structure of government, and role of separation of powers to mandatory learning curriculum of American Government. Requires Department of Education to submit a report on or before October 15 of odd numbered years documenting the implementation of required instruction in American government and to provide for professional development of teachers in the subject.

Effective: Upon passage and approval for regulatory and administrative tasks. July 1, 2019 for all other purposes.

AB 114 – Suicide Prevention

Requested by Assemblyman Ellison. Referred to Committee on Education. (BDR 34-647)

Requires Board of Education to adopt regulations establishing courses of study in the prevention of suicide for pupils in grades 5 to 12.

NTA Comment: This bill contains an unfunded mandate not requested by the affected local government. It provides the statutory provision (NRS354.599) that prohibits unfunded mandates to local government does not apply to this bill.

SB 91 – Commission on Innovation and Excellence in Education

Requested by Committee on Education and referred to same. On behalf of the Legislative Committee on Education. (BDR 34-386)

Establishes the Commission on Innovation and Excellence in Education to develop a statewide vision and implementation plan to improve the public education system in Nevada.

Effective: Upon passage and approval for regulatory and administrative tasks. July 1, 2019 for all other purposes.

SB 99 – Task Force on the Creation of a Career Pathway for Teachers

Requested by Committee on Education and referred to same. On behalf of the Legislative Committee on Education. (BDR 34-389)

Creates the Task Force on the Creation of a Career Pathway for Teachers to examine the scope of practice, professional development and typical duties and responsibilities of teachers and administrators to determine whether separate tiers of licenses or endorsements are beneficial to teaching, study systems of professional growth in school districts, and examine student teaching programs among other things.

Effective: Upon passage and approval for appointing members. July 1, 2019 for all other purposes.

SB 100 – Teacher Licensure

Requested by Committee on Education and referred to same. On behalf of the Legislative Committee on Education. (BDR 34-388)

Requires the Commission on Professional Standards in Education to establish regulations for an expedited procedure for the licensure of veterans and veterans' spouses.

Effective: Upon passage and approval for regulatory and administrative tasks. July 1, 2019 for all other purposes.

SB 101 – Basic Support Guarantee

Requested by Committee on Education and referred to same. On behalf of the Legislative Committee on Education. (BDR 34-387)

Revises date Superintendent of Public Instruction must present equity allocation model to Legislative Committee on Education from not later than July 1 to not later than May 1.

SB 105 – Selection of Clark and Washoe County School District Board of Trustees

Requested by Senator Kieckhefer. Referred to Committee on Education. (BDR 34-156)

Eliminates seven election districts in Clark and Washoe Counties. In Clark County three members are required to be elected at large and remaining members be appointed by county commissioners and the governing bodies of the three most populous cities. In Washoe County three members are required to be elected at large, two members are appointed by county commissioners from the two most populous cities and one member is appointed by the Governor.

SB 106 – School Supply Expenditures

Requested by Senator Kieckhefer. Referred to Committee on Education. (BDR 34-243)

Allows board of trustees of school district, charter school or university to reduce the amount of money they expend for textbooks if the school receives instructional supplies free of charge.

SB 109 – Special Education Classroom Cameras

Requested by Senator Hammond. Referred to Committee on Education. (BDR 34-10)

Requires School Districts and Charter Schools to install and maintain surveillance equipment in special education classrooms. Specifies the conditions under which the cameras are active and the persons that have access to the recordings. Establishes various dates for installation of the cameras.

Effective: Upon passage and approval for regulations. July 1, 2020 for all other purposes.

NTA Comment: This bill contains an unfunded mandate not requested by affected local governments. It provides the statutory provision (NRS 354.599) that prohibits unfunded mandates to local government does not apply to this bill.

GOVERNMENT: State**AB 70 – Open Meeting Law**

Requested by Committee on Government Affairs and referred to same. On behalf of the Attorney General. (BDR 19-421)

Authorizes a member of a public body, or a person subject to an action item on the agenda, to attend a meeting of the public body via teleconference or videoconference so long as they can be heard, and can participate. Requires the minutes of a public meeting be made available to the public within 30 working days after adjournment. Provides monetary fines for violating Open Meeting Law.

NTA Comment: This bill contains an unfunded mandate not requested by affected local governments. It provides the statutory provision (NRS 354.599) that prohibits unfunded mandates to local government does not apply to this bill.

NTA POSITION: AMEND. This bill provides the opportunity for better public access but should be amended to provide that: (1) the new monetary penalties, subsection 4 of Section 4, are deleted; (2) each member can hear any members of the public who may testify over telephone or by video; and (3) provide an effective date to allow local governments a couple of bienniums to budget and install the necessary equipment.

AB 89 – Employment: Veterans Preference

Requested by Committee on Government Affairs and referred to same. On behalf of Legislative Committee on Senior Citizens, Veterans, and Adults with Special Needs. (BDR 23-162)

Includes non-resident veterans for the purposes of State employment in classified service.

Effective: Upon passage and approval for regulatory and administrative tasks and October 1, 2019 for all other purposes.

AB 93 – Lake Tahoe: Grants to Nonprofits

Requested by Committee on Natural Resources, Agriculture, and Mining and referred to same. On behalf of the Legislative Committee for the Review and Oversight of the Tahoe Regional Planning Agency and the Marlette Lake Water System. (BDR 26-437)

Adds nonprofit organizations as eligible to receive grants from the Account for License Plates for the Support of the Preservation and Restoration of the Natural Environment of the Lake Tahoe Basin.

AB 108 – New State Employees

Requested by Assemblyman Fumo. Referred to Committee on Government Affairs. (BDR 23-762)

Requires State agencies to provide new employees orientation within the first 30 days of employment. Requires State agencies to allow an employee organization with more than 100 members to provide a presentation to new employees.

AB 103 – Collective Bargaining: Clarification

Requested by Assemblyman Wheeler. Referred to Committee on Government Affairs. (BDR 23-251)

A local government employer may provide leave to an employee for time spent performing duties for an employee organization if the full cost is paid for by the employee organization. Requires leave provided by a local government as of June 1, 2015, shall be deemed to have made concessions to offset the past, present and future cost of leave.

SB 103 – Reduce or Subsidize Fees for Which an Enterprise Fund was Created

Requested by Committee to Study Issues Regarding Affordable Housing. Introduced by Committee on Government Affairs. (BDR 22-379)

Authorizes local governments to reduce or subsidize fees for the issuance of building permits, imposed for the purpose for which an enterprise fund was created. Requires a public hearing on the issue.

SB 111 – Collective Bargaining Ending Fund Balance

Requested by Committee on Government Affairs and referred to same. (BDR 31-651)

For a local government other than a school district, the ending fund balance is changed to 16.67% instead of 25% of the total budgeted expenditures less capital outlay for a general fund is not subject to negotiations with an employee organization.

NTA Comment: See Issue 19-2, page 11.

NTA POSITION: SUPPORT. The percentage of an ending fund balance is not guaranteed from one year to the next. It is a safety net, which provides revenue to mitigate unexpected expenses particularly in economic downturn. Fact finders and arbitrators should not be able to include it in their decisions because it creates a future ongoing expense that may not be sustainable.

SB 127 – Increase of County Commissioners

Introduced by Senator Parks. Referred to Committee on Government Affairs. (BDR 20-855)

Increases number of Clark County Commissioners from 7 to 9. County Commissioners shall establish the additional districts and stagger the terms of members by ordinance.

Effective: October 1, 2019.

NTA Comment: This bill contains an unfunded mandate not requested by affected local government. It provides the statutory provision (NRS 354.599) that prohibits unfunded mandates to local government does not apply to this bill.

STATE BUDGET: Appropriations NOT in Executive Budget**AB 97 – Restrictions on Health Care Grants**

Requested by Committee on Health and Human Services. On behalf of the Legislative Committee on Health Care. (BDR 40-529)

Makes an appropriation of \$15,000,000 to be allocated by Public and Behavioral Health for health care grants and provides specific requirements for the receipt and expenditure of funds.

NTA Comment: The face of this bill does not contain the language “Contains an Appropriation Not Included in the Executive Budget.” It appears that NRS 281.D 4015 either requires that statement or the indication that the bill may have a fiscal impact but does not provide for both.

Requested by Assemblywoman Swank. Referred to Committee on Ways and Means. (BDR S-532)

Makes a \$350,000 appropriation from the General Fund to the Account for continuation of Nevada Main Street Programs.

AB 106 – Crisis Support Services of Nevada

Requested by Assemblywoman Krasner. Referred to Committee on Ways and Means. (BDR S-688)

Makes an appropriation of \$120,313 in both FY20 and FY21 for two additional full-time staffers at Crisis Support Services of Nevada.

AB 111 – Child Welfare and Juvenile Justice

Requested by Committee on Legislative Operations and Elections and referred to same. On behalf of Legislative Committee on Child Welfare and Juvenile Justice. (BDR S-451)

Makes an appropriation from the State General Fund of \$250,000 for FY2020 for the FY 20-21 biennium to the Legislative Committee on Child Welfare and Juvenile Justice to study the funding of the child welfare system in Nevada.

NTA Comment: The face of this bill does not contain the language “Contains an Appropriation Not Included in the Executive Budget.” It appears that NRS 281.D 4015 either requires that statement or the indication that the bill may have a fiscal impact but does not provide for both.

SB 93 – Commission for Deaf and Hard of Hearing

Requested by Committee on Health and Human Services and referred to same. On behalf of the Legislative Committee on Health Care. (BDR 38-449)

Changes the name of the Commission for Persons Who Are Deaf, Hard of Hearing or Speech Impaired to Commission for Persons Who Are Deaf and Hard of Hearing and changes the composition of the Commission. Makes an appropriation from the State General Fund of \$50,000 each year of the biennium for the purpose of paying travel and administrative costs of the Commission.

NTA Comment: The face of this bill does not contain the language “Contains an Appropriation Not Included in the Executive Budget.” It appears that NRS 281.D 4015 either requires that statement or the indication that the bill may have a fiscal impact but does not provide for both.

SB 94 – Account for Family Planning

Requested by Committee on Health and Human Services and referred to same. On behalf of the Legislative Committee on Health Care. (BDR 40-446)

Authorizes Administrator to use funds in Account for Family Planning to pay for family planning services provided by a division of State government which may include, without limitation, a contract with a community health nurse, a consultant or other person. Makes an appropriation of \$12,000,000 from the State General Fund to carry out those provisions.

SB 96 – Nevada Public Lands Grant Program

Requested by the Committee on Natural Resources and referred to same. On behalf of the Legislative Committee on Public Lands. (BDR 26-510)

Makes an appropriation of \$500,000 to create the Nevada Public Lands Grant Program for the purpose of awarding grants to eligible recipients to be used to provide matching funds required as a condition of any federal grant related to public lands. The money is not intended to be used to finance the ongoing expenditures of state agencies and must not be included in the base budget or in the proposed State Executive budget for the 2021 2023 biennium.

Effective: Upon passage and approval for adopting regulations. January 1, 2020 for all other purposes.

SB 102 – Western Regional Education Compact

Requested by Committee on Finance. On behalf of the Committee to Study the Needs Related to the Behavioral and Cognitive Care of Older Persons. (BDR S-98)

Makes an appropriation of \$77,000 in FY20 and \$77,000 in FY21 to Western Regional Education Compact for training 10 advanced nursing students on treating and understanding the special needs of elderly persons.

SB 110 – Community Based Programs for Reentry of Offenders

Requested by Senator Hammond. Referred to Committee on Finance. (BDR S-563)

Makes an appropriation of \$600,000 in FY20 and \$600,000 in FY21 to Department of Corrections for awarding of grants to community-based programs to assist offenders to reenter the community.

Effective: July 1, 2019 and expires by limitation September 30, 2021.

ELECTIONS

SB 107 – Elected Public Officer Filing Nomination Papers for Different Office

Requested by Senators Goicoechea and Settlemeyer. Referred to Committee on Legislative Operations and Elections. (BDR 24-18)

Requires an elected public official to resign that public office before filing nomination papers for any other elected office unless their current term expires less than 12 months preceding the date of the close of filing nomination papers or they are an elected official of a special or local or general improvement district.

Effective: On or after October 1, 2019 for a person who is an elected public officer.

SB 118 – Office of Registrar of Voters

Requested by Senator Settlemeyer. Referred to Committee on Legislative Operations and Elections. (BDR 20-597)

Authorizes Clark and Washoe county commission to create office of registrar of voters. Office will be elected every 4 years, enter office first Monday of January following election, take oath of office among others.

Effective: October 1, 2019 if Clark or Washoe County has appointed a registrar of voters, the person shall hold the office until the next general election in 2020.

SB 122 – Candidate Political Affiliation

Requested by Senator Settlemeyer. Referred to Committee on Legislative Operations and Elections. (BDR 24-52)

Requires a candidate for political office be registered for the party they seek to be a candidate for by December 31 preceding the closing filing date for that election.

Effective: Upon passage and approval for regulations. January 1, 2020 for all other purposes.

SB 123 – Same Day Registration and Voting

Requested by Committee on Legislative Operations and Elections and referred to same. (BDR 24-726)

Requires counties to register voters on day of primary and general elections at polling places.

Effective: October 1, 2019

NTA Comment: This bill contains an unfunded mandate not requested by affected local government. It provides the statutory provision (NRS 354.599) that prohibits unfunded mandates to local government does not apply to this bill.

SB 129 – Nevada Ethics in Government Law

Requested by Committee on Legislative Operations and Elections. On behalf of the Commission on Ethics. (BDR 23-191)

This is an extensive bill clarifying, revising and adding to existing provisions which govern: operations, powers, functions and duties of Commission, statutory ethical standards that apply to the conduct of current and former public officers and employees, and proceedings concerning requests for advisory opinions and ethics complaints and the issuance of opinions and the imposition of remedies and penalties by the commission among others.

NTA Comment: This bill contains an unfunded mandate not requested by affected local government. It provides the statutory provision (NRS 354.599) that prohibits unfunded mandates to local government does not apply to this bill.
