### TAXES: Administration

#### **SB 284, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Low Income Housing: Tax Credits Revised (Issue 10, page 57)**

Passed as amended, to Assembly.

Revises application timelines, allows project sponsor to transfer tax credits to more than one subsidiary or affiliate. Defines affiliate and subsidiary. Removes the prohibition against approving an application received after July 1, 2023. Prohibits approving an application that would exceed \$40,000,000 over the lifetime of the program.

### TAXES: Business

#### **SB 75, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Unemployment Compensation – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 1, page 1)**

Passed as amended, to Assembly.

Authorizes an extended benefit period to begin before the 14<sup>th</sup> week following the end of a prior extended benefit period, retroactively on and after December 27, 2020. Revises provisions relating to the judicial review of a decision of the Board of Review. Revises requirements for the payment of refunds and adjustments.

### TAXES: Combination

#### **AB 66, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint - Tax Abatements: Administration (Issue 1, page 2)**

Passed as amended, to Senate.

Requires the Department of Taxation to issue a document to approved businesses certifying an abatement or partial abatement of sales and use taxes. Authorizes an approved business to apply for a refund of sales and use taxes paid for which the business was entitled to an abatement or partial abatement.

### TAXES: Fuel and Vehicle

#### **AB 349, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Old Timer Vehicles: Registration and Licensing – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 10, page 58)**

Declared Exempt. Re-referred to Ways and Means.

Removes street rods from the provisions of the legislation. Revises time period for fuel emission exemptions. Identifies the State Environmental Commission as the agency required to issue waivers. Requires that fees charged for electronic monitoring programs be equal to the fee charged for forms certifying emission control compliance.

**Fiscal Impact:** The Department of Motor Vehicles estimates the changes to emission testing requirements will result in a fiscal impact of \$2,277,411 in FY2021-22 and \$4,717,707 in FY2022-23. An additional 516 hours of programming will be completed in-house.

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**AB 429, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Car Sharing – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 10, page 58)**

Declared Exempt. Amended and re-referred to Ways and Means.

Defines “car sharing start time” and “peer-to-peer car sharing”. Increases tort liability limit of shared vehicle from \$25,000 to \$50,000 for one person in any one crash and from \$50,000 to \$100,000 for two or more persons in any one crash.

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**AB 444, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Transportation Network Companies: Limousine Contracts (Issue 11, page 75)**

Passed as amended, to Senate.

Amends the term of driver for limousine services that contract with transportation network companies.

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**SB 288, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Transportation Network Companies: Autonomous Vehicles (Issue 10, page 58)**

Passed as amended, to Assembly.

Alters requirements relating to a transportation network company’s insurance requirements.

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**SB 389, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Car Sharing – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 10, page 59)**

Declared Exempt. Re-referred to Finance.

Requires the charging and collecting of fees for each shared vehicle driver through a peer-to-peer car sharing program, remittance made to the Department of Taxation.

Fiscal Impact: The Department of Taxation estimates a fiscal impact of \$374,871 in FY2021-22 and \$406,699 in FY2022-23 for additional personnel, along with associated operating costs and IT programming costs.

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**TAXES: Gaming****AB 7, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Provisions Related to Gaming Establishments - Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 1, page 2)**

Passed as amended, to Senate.

Deleted provisions relating to live entertainment tax. Establishes provisions for the approval of games or gambling devices.

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**AB 8, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Calculation of Gross Gaming Revenue (Issue 1, page 2)**

Passed as amended, to Senate.

Removes compensation for conducting contests and tournaments held in conjunction with interactive gaming from the definition of gross revenue.

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**TAXES: Marijuana****AB 322, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Events and Portable Sellers – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 9, page 44)**

Declared Exempt. Re-referred to Ways and Means.

Sets forth certain requirements for the issuance of cannabis event organizer licenses and portable cannabis vendor licenses in a local governmental jurisdiction that limits the number of business licenses issued to cannabis events.

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**AB 341, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Consumption Lounges – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 9, page 45)**

Declared Exempt. Re-referred to Ways and Means.

Authorizes Cannabis Compliance Board to reduce fees associated with an adult-use cannabis establishment license for an independent cannabis consumption lounge for social equity applicants.

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**SB 235, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Dual Use License – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 9, page 45)**

Declared Exempt. Re-referred to Finance.

Establishes a process to allow certain holders of a medical cannabis establishment license to be issued an adult-use cannabis establishment license.

**SB 278, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Cannabis Tax Exemption (Issue 9, page 45)**

Declared Exempt. Re-referred to Finance.

Defines “wholesale sale” for provisions of imposing tax. Deletes exemption provisions. Adds an exclusion from the definition of “wholesale sale” for transfers between facilities that share identical ownership.

**Fiscal Impact:** The Department of Taxation has determined that as amended this bill would no longer have a fiscal impact to the Cannabis Compliance Board.

**TAXES: Property****AB 414, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Real Property Transfer Tax: Exemption (Issue 10, page 59)**

Passed as amended, to Senate.

Provides that a person dealing with a beneficiary of a deed upon death has the same rights and protections as the person would have if the beneficiary had been named as a distributee of the property.

**SB 57, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint - Special Assessments: Property Tax Bills (Issue 1, page 3)**

Passed as amended, to Assembly.

Eliminates the 180 days or 12 months requirement of following court order regarding a public nuisance.

**TAXES: Room Tax****AB 408, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Residential Rental Room Tax: Room Remarketers – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 10, page 59)**

Declared Exempt. Re-referred to Ways and Means.

Directs the Legislative Commission to appoint a committee to conduct an interim study on the role of online travel companies in promoting tourism.

**TAXES: Transactions****SB 281, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Consumable Hemp Retailer – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 9, page 45)**

Declared Exempt. Re-referred to Finance.

Moves consumable hemp from the purview of the Department of Agriculture to the Department of Health and Human Services.

**Fiscal Impact:** As a result of the creation of a new tax type and increased taxpayer accounts, the Department of Taxation estimates a fiscal impact of \$485,963 in FY2022-23 for additional personnel and operating costs.

**SB 346, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Taxation of Digital Products – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 10, page 60)**

Declared Exempt. Re-referred to Finance.

Removes providers of home satellite television services from the provisions of the bill.

**Fiscal Impact:** The Department of Taxation estimates a fiscal impact of \$983,755 in FY2021-22 and \$1,046,688 in FY2022-23 for additional personnel, along with associated operating costs and IT programming costs. There will also be a revenue impact that cannot be determined.

### MISCELLANEOUS TAXES AND TAX ISSUES

**AB 20, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Film Tax Credits: Limitations (Issue 1, page 3)**

Passed as amended, to Senate.

Requires that to be eligible for transferable tax credits, the production company is required to enter into a written agreement with the Office that requires the production company to include a logo of the State in the end screen credits or provide an acknowledgement in the final version that the production was filmed or otherwise produced in Nevada.

**AB 59 – Regulation of Tobacco – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 1, page 4)**

Passed as amended, to Senate.

**1<sup>st</sup> Reprint** - Requires an inspection of each location at least once every 3 years. Eliminates the authorization for sellers to require customers to create an online account.

**2<sup>nd</sup> Reprint** - Increases the minimum legal sales age to purchase tobacco products and requires 3<sup>rd</sup> party verification system for delivery of tobacco products.

**AB 370, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Alcoholic Beverage Tax: Revenue Distribution (Issue 10, page 60)**

Amended and re-referred to Ways and Means.

Requires the State Controller to transfer to the Tax on Liquor Program Account the first \$200,000 of the tax on liquor containing more than 22 percent of alcohol by volume that is available in each biennium.

### FEES, FINES & PENALTIES

**AB 71, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Confidential Information for Rare or Endangered Species – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 1, page 4).** Passed as amended, to Senate.

Requires the Department of Natural Resources upon request to release confidential information to a person who is engaged in conservation, environmental review, or scientific research and enters into a written agreement which includes a provision that requires the person to maintain the confidentiality of the information to protect the rare plant, animal species or ecological community.

**AB 97, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Toxic Chemicals: Penalties – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 4, page 18)**

Passed as amended, to Senate.

Requires entities who discharge, use or release Class B firefighting foam to notify the Division of Environmental Protection of the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources within 24 hours after the discharge, use or release. Requires the Division to establish a working group to study environmental contamination resulting from perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances.

**AB 210, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Chiropractic Licensing – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 8, page 36)**

Passed as amended, to Senate.

Creates Class D felony for an entity that illegally operates an unregistered chiropractic facility.

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**AB 211, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Wildlife: Assessments – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 8, page 36)**

Passed as amended, to Senate.

Requires a governing body or planning commission to consider the potential impact on wildlife and wildlife habitat before taking final action on a tentative map.

Fiscal Impact: The Department of Wildlife estimates a fiscal impact of \$124,225 in FY2022-23 for personnel and operating and equipment costs.

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**AB 245, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Notary/Documentation Preparation Fees – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 8, page 36)**

Passed as amended, to Senate.

Authorizes notaries public to receive fees for performing notarial acts in addition to fees for performing document preparation services.

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**AB 256, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Medicaid Coverage of Doula Services – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 8, page 36)**

Declared Exempt. Amend and re-referred to Ways and Means.

Requires those who perform doula services to enroll with the Division of Health Care Financing and Policy.

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**AB 347, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Health Care Providers: Assessment – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 10, page 62)**

Declared Exempt. Amended and re-referred to Ways and Means.

Removes unfunded mandate. Requires the Legislative Commission on Health Care to study matters relating to the economics of health care.

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**AB 356, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Program for the Conservation of Water – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 10, page 62)**

Declared Exempt. Amended and re-referred to Ways and Means.

Requires the Board of Directors of the Southern Nevada Water Authority to develop a plan for the removal of nonfunctional turf.

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**AB 382, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Licensing: Student Loan Servicers – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 10, page 62)**

Declared Exempt. Amended and re-referred to Ways and Means.

In addition to the original registration and investigation fees the imposition of the fees charged is expanded.

Fiscal Impact: The Financial Institutions Division estimates a (\$25,662) fiscal impact in FY2021-22 and (\$49,631) in FY2022-23 for the staffing, regulatory development, investigations, and other matters related to the new statutory licensing and regulation program.

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**AB 387, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Licensing: Midwives – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 10, page 63)**

Declared Exempt. Amended and re-referred to Ways and Means.

Expands title to “certified professional midwife” and provides that a person may obtain a license through reciprocity if the person has been in practice for at least 3 years immediately preceding the date of the application. Requires all types of midwives practicing in this State to provide to clients a Community Birth Disclosure.

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**AB 391, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Licensing: Dispensing Opticians – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 10, page 63)**

Amended and re-referred to Ways and Means.

Section 9 establishes a schedule of fees and charges which may not be exceeded. Fees are set by regulation.

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**AB 399, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Certificate: Cage Free Eggs – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 10, page 63)**

Passed as amended, to Senate.

Prohibits, on or after July 1, 2022, a farm owner or operator from knowingly confining an egg-laying hen in an enclosure which has less than 1 square foot of usable floor space per egg-laying hen, requires an endorsement stating the egg products were produced by an egg-laying hen housed in an enclosure that is not prohibited. Creates civil penalty for farm owner or operator who knowingly restricts egg-laying hens.

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**SB 18, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Public Utilities: Fines (Issue 1, page 5)**

Passed as amended, to Assembly.

Increases the maximum administrative fine for violations by public utilities that are knowing, willful, or detrimental to public health or safety from \$1,000 to \$200,000 per day for each day of the violation, and increases the maximum total from \$100,000 to \$5,000,000.

**NTA POSITION ADDED: Oppose as the increase in administrative fees are excessive.**

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**SB 21, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Agencies that Serve Children: Background Checks – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 1, page 5)**

Passed as amended, to Assembly.

Requires public and private institutions and agencies to which a juvenile court commits a child which provide residential mental health treatment to children to conduct background investigations of applicants for employment. Includes the ability to charge an applicant the reasonable cost of the investigation.

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**SB 40, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Health Insurance: Claims Database – Removes 2/3s Majority Requirement (Issue 1, page 5)**

Declared Exempt. Amended and re-referred to Finance.

Requires the Department to establish regulations to establish an advisory committee concerning the collection, analysis and reporting of information in the database and to secure access and release of the data. Adds administrative sanctions for insurer's who fail to comply with laws or regulations governing the database.

Fiscal Impact: Health Care Financing and Policy has revised its fiscal note to include new timelines and contractual expenditures to \$1,397,609 for FY2021-22 and \$3,045,667 for FY2022-23.

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**SB 69, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Behavioral Health: Licensing and Fees and Substance Abuse in Public Schools – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 1, page 6).** Declared Exempt. Amended and re-referred to Finance.

Requires Department of Education to publish a list of evidence-based curricula and programs concerning the prevention of substance misuse and substance use disorder. Prescribes requirements governing those who provide peer recovery support services. Requires a person to be certified by the Nevada Certification Board before providing services for compensation. Authorizes in certain circumstances a person who is not certified to provide services for compensation as an intern.

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**SB 100, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Physical Therapy Licensure: Interstate Compact Commission – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 3, page 15).** Declared exempt. Amend and re-referred to Finance.

Requires a physical therapist to display credentials when operating under the Physical Therapy Licensure Compact in the same manner as a licensed physical therapist is required to display his or her license.

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**SB 125, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Falconry License: Golden Eagles. Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 5, page 22)**

Passed as amended, to Assembly.

Authorizes a person who is licensed as a master falconer and who meets federal criteria to possess a golden eagle. Authorizes the Commission to include in regulations authority to also "transfer" in addition to transport, possess, or use a golden eagle in falconry. Requires the Commission to adopt regulations imposing civil penalties against persons violating prohibitions against tampering with bald eagles and golden eagles.

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**SB 165, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Nevada ESports Commission – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 7, page 32)**

Declared Exempt. Amended and re-referred to Finance.

Requires the Commission to establish a technical advisory committee to recommend regulations pertaining to esports.

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**SB 175, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Healthcare Facility Reporting – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 8, page 36)**

Declared Exempt. Amended and re-referred to Finance.

Appropriates from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Human Services \$87,593 in FY2021-22 and \$112,485 in FY2022-23 to support the reporting system of information on lupus and its variants. Any remaining balance on September 16, 2022, and September 15, 2023, respectively, reverts to the General Fund.

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**SB 198, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – On-Demand Pay Providers – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 8, page 37)**

Amended and re-referred to Finance.

Requires surety bond for on demand pay providers. Authorizes the Commissioner to conduct examination of licensees and to charge a fee for the examination. Establishes procedures for filing complaints and disciplinary action.

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**SB 201, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Pharmaceutical Sales Representatives – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 8, page 37)**

Declared Exempt. Amended and re-referred to Finance.

Requires that fees collected for the licensure of pharmaceutical sales representation must be accounted for separately in the General Fund, used only to cover the costs of licensing and regulating pharmaceutical sales representatives and for the purposes of improving transparency concerning the costs of prescription drugs, and do not revert to the General Fund at the end of the fiscal year.

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**SB 274, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Receiving Center: Exploited Children – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 9, page 46)**

Declared Exempt. Amended and re-referred to Finance.

Revises the actions that a child welfare services agency is required to take in response to a report of the commercial sexual exploitation of a child.

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**SB 282, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Real Estate Division: Technology Fee – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 10, page 63)**

Declared Exempt. Amended and re-referred to Finance.

Revises the provisions governing the Real Estate Education, Research and Recovery Fund amending the minimum reserve from \$300,000 to \$100,000. Creates the Account for Real Estate Administration in the General Fund to pay for the administrative expenses of the Division. The interest and money earned on money in the account must be credited to the Account and any money remaining in the Account at the end of the fiscal year does not revert to the General Fund and must be carried forward to the next fiscal year.

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**SB 291, 1<sup>st</sup> Reprint – Licensing: Estheticians – Requires 2/3s Majority (Issue 10, page 64)**
